He was born in New York, ordained in Jerusalem, and served congregations in New Jersey and Florida before coming to California where, in 1992, he founded our Temple of the Arts. He authored our Temple prayer books *Sacred Space* and *Sacred Moments* as well as the best-selling *Moses on Management: Leadership Lessons in Life* published by Simon and Schuster. He has made numerous television appearances and consulted on many major motion pictures and television series. Rabbi Baron pioneered the fusion of religion

in the arts and was the lead participant in the TED "Charter on Compassion" as well as a Founding Advisory Board Member of the Museum of the Bible in Washington, D.C.

Cantor Lam has been a venerated voice teacher to many stars in the music industry. He also has been a music producer, documentary producer, "100 voices - A Journey Home," and released many albums spanning the vast spectrum of Jewish music, religious and secular.

composition, Sharon has been working with broadcasters like NBC, CBS, Showtime, Life-time and the WB as well as writing music for feature films and documentaries. Her film music has been released commercially and performed live in concerts. Sharon is currently scoring the successful Israeli TV show *Red Skies* as well as a feature film, *Jacob the Baker*. Sharon's latest scores include the award-winning documentary *Brainwashed-Sex-Camera-Power* and *Don't Sweat The Small Stuff: The Kristine Carlson Story* for LIFETIME TV. She is one of 8 female composers featured at the "Women Warriors" Lincoln Center concert that won the 2022 GRAMMY Award. The International Film Music Critics Association wrote about her music: "Composer Sharon Farber wowed the crowd with a suite of music from three of her scores: *Children of the Fall, When Nietzsche Wept* and *The Dove Flyer...*"

Sharon's Corona project, arranged and produced by her for the United Nations' Corona relief fund in collaboration with iconic songwriter Diane Warren and director Gev Miron, features singers and instrumentalists from virtually every continent. In the concert music world, Sharon has many national and international credits and commissions, including The Los Angeles Master Chorale, Juilliard School of Music, Pacific Serenade Ensemble, The National Childrens Chorus, The Northwest Sinfonietta, Opera Naţională Bucureşti in venues such as Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Disney Hall and Dorothy Chandler Pavilion. She has recently returned from Italy, where she taught film music at the Guitar Oasis International Music Festival, and from London, where her music was recorded at the renowned Abbey Road Studios.




TEMPLE ROTUNDA and LOBBY HISTORIC RESTORATION

We are excited to announce that we have begun the historic restoration and remodeling of the lobby of our Temple's home, the Saban Theatre. We have commissioned the world leading experts in historic theatre restoration (Pantages, Radio City, etc.) Evergreene Studios, to restore our **Joyce and Stanley Black Rotunda** to its 1930's splendor including the original art deco chandelier. This space will be

used for services once metro construction ends. The diamond shaped lobby bar built in 1985 will be demolished and replaced with bars in the rear to make a wider space for our events and celebrations (Bar/Bat mitzvahs, weddings etc).

Rabbi Baron's High Holy Day Guests

Aron Bell

Aron Bielski (born July 21, 1927 in Stankevich, Belarus), later changed to Aron Bell, is a Polish-American Jew and former member of the Bielski Brigade, the largest group of Jewish armed fighters against the Nazis and rescuers of over 1200 Jews during World War II. He was also known as Arczyk Bielski. The youngest of the four Bielski brothers, he is the only one still living (Asael died in 1945, Tuvia in 1987, and Alexander "Zus" in 1995).

Cristiano Zeledón

24-year-old former U.S. Marine Cristiano was wounded in Ukraine, while serving as a volunteer providing humanitarian aid.

On July 27, 2023, Russian troops fired missiles into the Ukranian city of

Kramatorsk in the Donetsk province. Cristiano recovered in a Ukranian hospital from severe head injuries and burns.

Cristiano first became involved in assisting Ukranian humanitarian work through the relief efforts of Israeli-American businessman and philanthropist Mordecai "Moti" Kahana.

Jonny Daniels

As founder of FromThe Depths.org, Daniels travels extensively to poor Eastern European villages, seeking out Holocaust survivors and rescuers, preserving their acts of heroism and bring them food and medical supplies. Jonny also led the effort in saving a Torah scroll from the flames of the Shoah, inviting survivirs to write letters to complete its restoration.

In Preparation for NEW YEAR 5784 HIGH HOLY DAYS

ccording to Jewish Law (Halakha) the entire month preceding Rosh Hashana (Elul) is a time for spiritual inventory-taking and reconciliation. In some synagogues, the shofar is actually sounded every morning at the daily service (minyan) to awaken us to a repentance frame of mind. I would like to recommend a few steps for you to consider taking in preparation for the Days of Awe.

Reconciliation: Take the first bold step by text, phone, email or in person with someone you have felt alienated from and enjoy the possible fruits of reconciliation.

Take a few Sacred Moments: Open our beautiful Chagall prayer book and read the meditation passages before coming to Temple. I recommend pages 1, 15, 20, 50, 88, 91, 108, 239-268. Try reading one each day between now and Yom Kippur. Also, you might want to refamiliarize yourself with the Hebrew refrain to the classic prayers. If you don't read Hebrew, try reviewing the transliterations: "Avot" on page 15, "B'rosh Hashana" on page 98, "Ha-Yom" on page 109, "Avinu Malkeynu" on page 49, and "Barchu" on pages 33 and 34.

Frequently Asked Questions at Yom Kippur -

Question: What if I can't fast or must drink water with my meds?

Answer: Jewish Law insists that anyone ill, or taking medications or pregnant women do not have to fast. (However out of respect for fellow worshipers please do not bring food or drinks into the sanctuary).

Question: What if I can't stand each time the Holy Ark is opened?

Answer: Please feel free to remain seated if rising for each Ark opening is too arduous.

Question: What if my parents are still alive —shouldn't I leave for Yizkor?

Answer: No, you can recite the Yizkor memorial prayers for other relatives or fallen American and Israeli soldiers. It is superstition that you must skip Yizkor if your parents are still living.

No Politics in Shul - I have long observed a policy of not engaging in political commentary in the synagogue. I feel it is destructive. We are overwhelmed by political commentary all year via the news media and social media. The Temple is a refuge from all of that and must remain so. I declined the invitation to deliver the invocation at the Republican National Convention and would have done the same if invited to deliver one at the Democratic Convention. 
